



The electromagnet was invented in England by William Sturgeon, who took an iron rod and bent it into the shape of a horseshoe. This "horseshoe" was coated with varnish and a layer of copper wire was wrapped around it. An electric current was passed through the wire, thus making the rod magnetic. The rod was now, because of magnetic attraction, able to support nine pounds of iron.

In the U.S., a scientist named Joseph Henry improved on Sturgeon's electromagnet by insulating the copper wire with silk. He was able to wrap many turns of wire around an iron

core without danger of short circuits between the turns. His magnet could hold 2,300 pounds.

This experiment prompted Henry to try his hand at converting magnetism into electricity. First, he coiled some insulated wire around an iron bar, connecting both ends of the wire to a galvanometer. The iron bar was placed across the poles of the electromagnet. Then the coil of the electromagnet was connected to a battery. The galvanometer indicated a voltage, then dropped to zero. Henry signaled his assistant to disconnect the coil. The galvanometer showed that once again a voltage had been produced, although this time in the opposite direction. The principle of electromagnetic induction had thus been discovered. Unfortunately for Joseph Henry he did not publish his findings and someone else (Faraday) got the credit for the discovery.



For as long as he lived, Cosimo de Medicj was in charge of the running of the city of Florence. He ruled by pretending not to rule at all. He did not hold a public office himself but the city council

Many steps are required in successfully prosecuting a criminal case nowadays. Once the crime has been committed and discovered, the police force is dispatched to the crime scene to begin the investigation. Simultaneously, any possible suspects or witnesses are taken in for questioning at the local police station having jurisdiction over the case.

Suspects and witnesses can be subjected to mild inquisition or full-scale interrogation, depending upon the severity of the matter. During this time, suspects might be held in detention until their denial of the crime, or alibi, can be verified. In the event that a confession is given or enough evidence is uncovered to incriminate the suspect, he or she is charged with the crime, if there are no extenuating circumstances. Thereafter, the suspect is taken into custody or released on bail.

The case is then prosecuted in court. Many witnesses testify during the trial, giving testimony to implicate or exonerate the accused. When the judge strikes his gavel, he thereby indicates that the jury should recess for impartial deliberation of the verdict. The jury may find the accused innocent of the crime, whereupon he or she will be acquitted and released. On the other hand, the jury might find the accused guilty of the crime. The accused is then formally convicted of the crime, sentenced to the appropriate number of years for the violation of law, and imprisoned.

The eyes of human beings are not sensitive to all light, but only to that between wavelengths of 380 and 760 millimicrons. This fact prevents us from being aware that our bodies **emit** electromagnetic waves. These waves are mostly longer than those we are sensitive to, but thermographic techniques can translate them into extraordinary color pictures.

Because they are instantly in motion, atoms generate infrared rays, and the warmer the atoms are the more active they become. This results in thermographic pictures revealing different parts of the body in different colors: black and blue for the cold, green and yellow for the cool or slightly warm **ones**, and orange and red for those which are hot.

All this has a health application, for such problems as tumors, arthritis, and cancer are shown as isolated red areas in the thermographic portraits.

One of the greatest problems for settlers in Nebraska in the last quarter of the century was fuel. Little of the state was forested when the first settlers arrived, and it is probable that, by 1880, only about one-third of the originally area remained, down to a mere one percent of the state's 77,000 square miles. With wood and coal **out of the question**, and with fuel needed yearround for cooking – and during the harsh winters for heating – some solutions had to be found.

Somewhat improbably, the buffalo provided the answer. Buffalo chips were found to burn evenly, hotly, and cleanly with little smoke and no odor. Soon, collecting them became a way of life for the settler's children who would pick them up on the way to and from local schools, or take part in competitions designed to counteract **their** natural reluctance. Indeed, even a young man seeking to impress the girl he wanted to marry would arrive with a large bag of chips rather than with an **enticing** box of candy or an attractive bunch of flowers.
