keel over

keels, keeling, keeled

keel over

(١) (الغارب) يَنْقَلِبُ.

e.g. Their boat keeled over in a storm.

(٢) (شخص) يَمُتُّعُ.

e.g. He finished the bottle of whiskey, got up to leave and keeled over.

keep after/ at (sb.)

تُمَارِسُ صَفْعًا عَلَى شَخْصٍ يَتَكَرَّرُ الطَّلَبُ.

e.g. She keeps after me to buy her a television for her bedroom but so far I have resisted.

keep (sb.) ahead

keep ahead

تُسْتَوِزُ فِي اللَّعْمَةِ عَلَى الْآخِرِينَ.

e.g. The selling power of the name will keep them ahead of their rivals.

keep (sb.) at (sth.)

keep at

تُتَلَهَّرُ فِي الْعَمَلِ رَعْمَ صُعُوبَتِهِ.

e.g. Learning a language is hard work and you have to keep at it.

keep away (sb./ sth.) or keep (sb./ sth.) away

تَكْفُفُ عَنْ حُجْمِ عَن تَمْتَنِعُ عَنْ تَبْتِوَدُ عَنْ.

e.g. There was a notice warning people to keep away from the cliff

e.g. He keeps away from liquor and tobacco.

keep away (sth.) or keep (sth.) away

تَتَّعُ مَرَضًا مِنْ أَنْ يُغَيِّبَكَ.

e.g. He takes garlic tablets every morning to keep colds away.

keep back (sb./ sth.) or keep (sb./ sth.) back

بَصَدُ (شَخْصًا) عَنْ مَكَانٍ. تَبْتِوَدُ عَنْ شَيْءٍ.

e.g. Barriers were built to keep back the flood water.

e.g. Once a firework is lit, you should keep well back.

keep back (sth.) or keep (sth.) back

(١) كَتَفِظَ بِالسَّرِّ تَكْتُمُ الْأَمْرَ.

e.g. You're keeping something back from us.

(٢) حَتَّجِزَ جُزْأًا مِنَ الْكَمِّيَّةِ لِتَسْتَعْمِلَهَا فِي غَرَضٍ آخَرَ.

e.g. Fry the onions in two thirds of the butter, keep back a third for the sauce.

(٣) كَتَفِظَ بِجُزْءٍ مِنَ الْأَجْرِ يُسْتَقَلُّ فِي عَمَلٍ آخَرَ.

e.g. Your employers will keep back 7% of your salary to pay into your pension.

keep down (sth.) or keep (sth.) down

(١) يُقَلِّصُ. يَحْدُ مِنْ حَجْمِ أَوْ عَدَدٍ.

e.g. The government are desperate to keep inflation down.

(٢) يَخْفِضُ الصَّوْتِ.

e.g. Could you keep the noise down? I'm trying to sleep.

(٣) (المرضى) يُحَاوِلُ الْأَحْتِقَاطَ بِالْأَكْلِ أَوْ الشَّرْبِ نَوْنًا أَنْ يَتَقَبَّأًا.

e.g. For three days after the operation she couldn't keep anything down.

keep down (sb.) or keep (sb.) down

يَغْفَهَرُ بِسَبْطِطِرٍ عَلَى. يَفْتَمَعُ. يَتَحَكَّمُ فِي.

e.g. The government intends to keep down the revolutionaries.

keep from

يَحْتَفِظُ بِسِرِّ وَلَا يَبْوُحُ بِهِ.

e.g. I tend to keep things like that from my daughter because it just upsets her.

keep (sb.) from (sth.)

تَمْتَعُ شَخْصًا مِنْ عَمَلٍ تُعْطَلُهُ.

e.g. Well, I'd better go. I don't want to keep you from your studies.

keep (sb./ sth.) from doing (sth.)

(١) تَمَتَّعَ بِشَخْصًا مِنَ الْقِيَامِ بِتَصْرُفٍ مَثَلًا.
e.g. I had to put my hand across her mouth to keep her from shouting.

(٢) تَمَتَّعَ حَدُوثٌ شَيْئًا.
e.g. A drop of oil in the pan will keep the spaghetti from sticking together.

keep (sb.) in

(١) يَحْبِسُ. يَحْتَجِزُ بِيَقِي (التَّلَامِيذُ فِي الْمَكْرَسَةِ).
e.g. The teacher decided to keep them in all afternoon, as a punishment for bad behavior.

(٢) تَسْتَبْقِي (مَرِيضًا) فِي الْمُسْتَشْفَى حَتَّى يُشْفَى.
e.g. The doctors thought she was all right but they kept her in overnight for observation.

keep in (sth.) or keep (sth.) in

تَكَبِتَ مَسَاعِرَكَ. تَكْتُمُ أَرْأَكَ.
e.g. I'd been feeling such intense frustration for a long time and I just couldn't keep it in any more.

keep in

النِّزْمُ النَّيْمِينَ مِنَ الشَّارِعِ (غَالِبًا فِي صِبْغَةِ أُمُرٍ).
e.g. Keep in! There's a car coming.

keep in with (sb.)

تَسْتَمِرُّ فِي صَدَاقَتِكَ لِشَخْصٍ (غَالِبًا لِضَلْحَتِكَ).
e.g. It's always good to keep in with your ex-employers, you never know when you're going to need them.

keep off

جَنَّبَ الذَّهَابَ إِلَى مَنطِقَةٍ. أَبْعَدَ عَنْهَا.
e.g. Motorists have been advised to keep off the busy main roads.

keep off (sth.) or keep (sth.) off

نُبِعِدَ شَيْئًا عَنِ شَيْءٍ لِتَلَاوِي الضَّرَرِ.
e.g. He'd put a cloth over the plates to keep off flies from the food.

e.g. She wore a hat to keep the sun off.

keep (sb.) off (sth.)

(١) تَبْتَعِدُ عَنِ أَكْلِ أَوْ شُرْبِ مَا يَضُرُّ بِكَ أَوْ تُبْعِدُ (بِشَخْصًا) عَنِ أَكْلِ أَوْ شُرْبِ مَا يَضُرُّهُ.
e.g. I'm keeping off cheese and fatty food generally.

(٢) تَمْتَنِعُ عَنِ الْكَلَامِ فِي مَوْضُوعٍ مُعَيَّنٍ أَوْ تَمْتَنِعُ الْأَخْرِينَ مِنَ الْكَلَامِ فِيهِ.
e.g. I tried to keep him off politics because when he starts there's no stopping him.

keep off

الطَّفْسُ السَّيِّئُ (مَطَرٌ تُلُجٌّ) يَنْحَبِسُ.
e.g. I hope the rain keeps off.

keep on doing (sth.)

بَسْتَمِرُّ فِي عَمَلِ شَيْءٍ.
e.g. She kept on asking me questions the whole time.

keep on (sb.) or keep (sb.) on

كَتَفَظَ بِشَخْصٍ فِي الْخِدْمَةِ.
e.g. They got rid of most of the staff but kept one or two people on.

keep on (عامية)

(١) تُوَاصِلُ الْكَلَامَ لِكَلِمَةٍ طَوِيلَةٍ بِطَرِيقَةٍ مُلَوِّةٍ.
e.g. He kept on about how much he was earning till we were all sick of hearing about it.

(٢) تَسْتَمِرُّ فِي السَّبْرِ غَالِبًا فِي طَرِيقٍ وَاجِدٍ لِتَحْصِلَ لِكُلِّ مَا.
e.g. We'll just keep on and hope that we see a signpost.

keep on at (sb.) (never in continuous tenses)

تُتَلَاحِقُ شَخْصًا بِالشُّكْوَى أَوْ التَّفُذِ.
e.g. I wish she wouldn't keep on at me, it's not my fault.

keep out (sb./ sth.) or keep (sb./ sth.) out

(١) يَبْتَعِدُ عَنِ مَكَانٍ أَوْ يُبْعِدُ شَيْئًا عَنِ مَكَانٍ.
e.g. We hung up a thick curtain to keep out the flies.

(٢) أَبْعَدُ (بِصِبْغَةِ الْأَمْرِ).
e.g. "Unsafe building" "Keep out!"

keep (sb./ sth.) out of (sth.)

keep out of

تَتَجَنَّبُ التَّنَحُّلَ فِي مَوْضِعٍ أَوْ تُبْعِدُ شَخْصًا عَنِ التَّنَحُّلِ فِيهِ.

e.g. When they start arguing I just keep out of it.

e.g. That should keep you out of trouble for a while.

keep to (sth.)

(١) يَلْتَزِمُ بِنِطْقَةٍ خَاصَّةٍ، يَتَّقَبَدُ بِهَا.

e.g. I was in a hurry so I thought I'd better keep to the main roads.

(٢) يَلْتَزِمُ بِمَوْضِعٍ وَيَتَكَلَّمُ فِيهِ.

e.g. I wish she'd keep to the point when she's telling you something.

(٣) يَبْرُؤُ بِوَعْدِهِ، يَتَمَسَّكُ بِمَا وَعَدَ بِهِ أَوْ حَظَطَ لَهُ.

e.g. We have to keep to the terms of the agreement.

keep (sth.) to (sth.)

حَافِظٌ عَلَى كَمِّيَّةٍ أَوْ عَدَدٍ مَعْيِنٍ لَا يَزِيدُ عَنْهُ.

e.g. I'm trying to keep costs to a minimum.

e.g. If we keep the dinner party to six it'll be easier to cook for.

keep (sth.) to yourself (always reflexive)

تَحْفِظُ بِالنَّسْرِ لِنَفْسِكَ.

e.g. She tends to keep her opinions to herself.

keep up

(١) يَحَافِظُ عَلَى مُسْتَوَاهُ.

e.g. She was walking so fast that I couldn't keep up with her.

(٢) يُوَاصِلُ التَّقَدُّمَ وَيُجَارِي الْأَخْرَبِينَ.

e.g. Prices have been rising very fast and wages haven't kept up.

e.g. He finds it difficult to keep up with the rest of the class.

(٣) يَفْهَمُ وَيَتَعَامَلُ مَعَ أُمُورٍ كَثْرَتِ بِسُرْعَةٍ.

e.g. We've received so many orders for our products that our staff can't keep up.

e.g. My Italian friends talk so fast, I simply can't keep up with what they're saying.

keep up (sth.) or keep (sth.) up

يَسْتَمِرُّ فِي عَمَلِ شَيْءٍ بِمَا تَوَلَّفَ. يَحْطَلُ الْجَوُّ صَحْوًا (مَثَلًا).

e.g. It's been wonderful weather this spring, let's hope it keeps up.

e.g. We must keep up the pressure on the government to change this law.

Keep up (sth.) or keep (sth.) up

(١) حَافِظٌ عَلَى مُسْتَوَى شَيْءٍ.

e.g. Make sure you eat properly, you've got to keep your strength up.

(٢) حَافِظٌ بِرُوحٍ عَالِيَةٍ.

e.g. Keep your spirits up.

(٣) حَافِظٌ عَلَى مُسْتَوَاكَ أَوْ مَهَارَتِكَ.

e.g. I've tried to keep up my Spanish by going to evening classes.

(٤) تَصُونٌ مَنَزَلًا، حَافِظٌ بِهِ فِي حَالِهِ طَيِّبَةٍ.

e.g. It takes a lot of money to keep up an old house.

upkeep (n.)

صِبَاغَةٌ.

e.g. The tenant is responsible for the upkeep of the farm buildings.

keep (sb.) up

تُوَجَّرُ (شَخْصًا) عَنِ مِبْقَادِ نَوْمِهِ.

e.g. Anyway, I don't want to keep you up, you look tired.

keep it up

تَسْتَمِرُّ فِي الْعَمَلِ بِجِدِّ.

e.g. You're doing very well, everybody, keep it up.

key in (sth.) or key (sth.) in key (sth.) into (sth.)

keys, keying, keyed

key in/ into

يُدْخِلُ مَعْلُومَاتٍ فِي كُمْبِيُوتَرٍ بِوَأَسِطَةِ لَوْحَةِ الْمَتَابِيعِ.

e.g. I've got all the data now but it still needs to be keyed in.

key (sth.) to (sth.)

تَوْصَّبَ سَبِيئًا لِيَتَأَسَّبَ (سَخَّصًا خَاصًّا أَوْ مَوْفِعًا مَا).
e.g. Each player is paid a salary keyed to his position and ability.

key up

يَضْطَّرِبُ. يَنْفَعِلُ لِـ (سَمَاعِو الثَّبَا).
e.g. She's all keyed up because of the latest bulletin.
e.g. They are keyed up to a high pitch of expectancy.

kick (sb.) about/ around

kicks, kicking, kicked
kick about/ around

يَضْطَّهِدُ. يُزَيِّبُ. (مَنْ هُمْ أَضْعَفُ مِنْهُ).
e.g. I'm just sick of being kicked around by employers.

kick about/ around (sth.) or kick (sth.) about/ around (عَامِيَّة)

يُنَاقِشُ آرَاءَ مَعَ مَجْمُوعَةٍ مِنَ النَّاسِ. يُقَلِّبُ الْأُمُورَ.
e.g. Once a week the whole team gets together to kick around a few ideas.

kick about/ around (swh.)

يَتَسَكَّعُ. يَنْتَقِلُ مِنْ مَكَانٍ لِآخَرَ بِلا هَدَفٍ.
e.g. She kicked around the States for a year or so, then came home.

be kicking around/ about (swh.) (always in continuous tenses) (عَامِيَّة)

(الكِتَاب) مَثَلًا بِقِي مَهْمَلًا.
e.g. We've probably got a copy of it kicking around the office somewhere.

kick around with (sb.)

يَقْضِي الْوَقْتَ مَعَ (شَخْصٍ أَوْ أَشْخَاصٍ).
e.g. They were just a couple of guys I used to kick around with.

kick back (عَامِيَّة)

يَسْتَرْجِي. يَسْتَرْجِحُ.
e.g. Tonight I just want to kick back and watch some baseball on T.V.

kick back (sth.) or kick (sth.) back

(١) تَدْفَعُ حِصَّةً أَوْ نَصِيبًا مِنْ صَفَقَةٍ أَوْ عَمَلٍ غَيْرِ مَشْرُوعٍ.

e.g. She kicked back part of her fee to the agent who introduced the client to her.

kickback (n.)

e.g. The customs officer was accused of receiving bribes and kickbacks.

(٢) (الْمُتْرَكُ مَثَلًا) يَرْتَدُّ.
e.g. The engine kicked back.

kick down (sth.) or kick (sth.) down

تَضْرِبُ أَوْ تَدْفَعُ بَابًا أَوْ حَائِطًا بِعُنْفٍ حَتَّى يَفْعَ.
e.g. He threatened to kick the door down if I didn't open it.

kick down (sth.) or kick (sth.) down (عَامِيَّة)

يَبْطِئُ سَبِيرَ مَرْكَبَةٍ أَوْ سَيَّارَةٍ.
e.g. You'll have to kick down to a lower gear on the hill.

kick in (sth.) or kick (sth.) in

يُحْطَمُ بِالرُّفْسِ أَوْ الرُّكْلِ. تَخْلَعُ أَوْ تَنْزِعُ بِرُكْلَةٍ قَدَمَ (البَابِ مَثَلًا).

e.g. The attackers kicked the door in.
e.g. The thugs kicked his teeth in.

kick off

(١) يَضْرِبُ الْكُرَّةَ إِذْنًا بِبَدَنِ الْمَارَّةِ. يَبْدَأُ الشُّوْطَ.
e.g. What time do they kick off?

kickoff (n.)

(٢) يَدَايَةِ اللَّعِبِ أَوْ الْمَارَّةِ.
e.g. The kick off's at 2.00.

(٣) (لُغَةٌ سُورِيَّةٌ) يَكُوتُ.
e.g. He was in his 90 when he kicked off.

kick off (sth.)

يَخْلَعُ حِذَاءَهُ بِدَفْعِهِ مِنَ الْقَدَمِ.
e.g. She kicked off her shoes and danced barefoot.

kick out (sb.) or kick (sb.) out

يَطْرُدُ (شَخْصًا).
e.g. He was kicked out of the college in the second year.

kick (out) against (sth.)

تُعَارِضُ بِشِدَّةٍ، تُعَبِّرُ عَنِ مَعَارَضَتِكَ وَعَضْبِكَ.

e.g. You've got to kick against the system, it's part of being a student.

kick over (sth.) or kick (sth.) over

بَرَّكَلَ (سَبِينًا) لِيَقَعَ عَلَى جَانِبِهِ.

e.g. He stood up and in his rage kicked the chair over.

Kick over (تغيير أمريكي)

مَحْرَكَ السَّيَّارَةِ يَفْعَلُ.

e.g. The engine isn't kicking over.

kick (sth.) over

يَتِمُّ الْفَعْلُ.

e.g. Don't worry about the washing-up, we'll kick that over in no time.

kick up (sth.) or kick (sth.) up

(١) تُثِيرُ التُّرَابَ أَوْ الرُّمْلَ عِنْدَ التَّنَسِّي أَوْ الرُّكُضِ.

e.g. The horses had kicked up a cloud of dust.

(٢) تَرْفَعُ الْأَسْفَارَ أَوْ الْأَرْبَاحَ.

e.g. The landlord has kicked up the rent.

kick up (تغيير أمريكي)

أَعْضُو مِنْ لَصْفَةِ الْجِسْمِ يُؤَلِّمُ لِأَنَّهُ لَا يَفْعَلُ بِكَمْفَاقَةٍ وَكَذَلِكَ أَي جُزْءٍ مِنَ الْأَلَةِ.

e.g. My knee is starting to kick up again after yesterday's run.

kick up (sth.)

يُحَدِّثُ ضَجَّةً، يُقِيمُ الدُّنْيَا.

e.g. She kicked up a fuss about the poor service in the hotel.

kid about/ around

kids, kidding, kidded

kid about/ around

يَتَصَرَّفُ بِطَرِيقَةٍ عَجِيبَةٍ.

e.g. Stop kidding around and listen to me!

kid on

يُعَاكِسُ، يُضَلِّقُ.

e.g. Stop kidding us all on.

kill off (sth./ sb.) or kill (sth./ sb.) off

kill off

يَقْتُلُ، يُفْضِي عَلَى نَوْعٍ مِنَ الْحَيَوَانَاتِ.

e.g. The bacteria in raw meat is killed off during cooking.

kill off (sth.) or kill (sth.) off

(١) يُبِيدُ، يَضْرِبُ فِي مَقْتَلٍ، يُفْضِي عَلَى.

e.g. The government had effectively killed off the local industry by allowing cheap imports.

(٢) (عَامِّيَّة) يُلْغِي عَلَى كَمِّيَّةِ الطَّعَامِ أَوْ الشَّرَابِ.

يُنْهِي.

e.g. There's hardly any wine left- let's kill off the bottle.

kill off (sb.) or kill (sb.) off

(الكَتَابُ) يَتَخَلَّصُ مِنْ شَخْصِيَّةٍ فِي رِوَايَةٍ أَوْ فِيلْمٍ بِالنُّوْتِ.

e.g. Canan Doyle got bored with Sherlock Holmes and decided to kill him off.

kip down

kips, kipping, kipped

kip down

تُفْضِي اللَّيْلَ بَعِيدًا عَنِ الْبَيْتِ وَعَنِ سَرِيرِكَ.

e.g. Is it all right if we kip down on your floor tonight?

kiss off (always an order) (لُغَةٌ سُوِّيَّة)

kisses, kissing, kissed

kiss off

أَبْعِدْ عَنِّي، انْهَبْ بَعِيدًا.

e.g. Why don't you tell him to kiss off.

kiss-off (n.) (لُغَةٌ سُوِّيَّة)

تَتَخَلَّصُ مِنْهُ.

e.g. He's the latest of her admirers to get the kiss off.

kiss off (sb./ sth.) or kiss (sb./ sth.) off

تُعْتَبِرُ سَلْبًا أَقْلَ أَهْمِيَّةٍ أَوْ نَوْعِيَّةٍ مِنْ نَظَائِرِهِ وَتَسْتَفْئِي عَنْهُ (عَامِّيَّة).

e.g. A lot of doctors don't give other therapies a chance, they just kiss them off.

kiss up to (sb.)

(أَمْرِيكِيَّة غَامِيَّة)

تَتَمَلَّقُ شَخْصًا مِنْ دَوَى الثَّمُودِ.

e.g. I want the promotion but I'm not prepared to kiss up to Mike in order to get it.

kiss away

(١) يَنْسَحُ أَحْرَارَتَهَا.

e.g. He tried to kiss away her tears.

(٢) تَرَدَّ الْمُتَلِّة.

e.g. He kissed her and she kissed him back.

kit out (sb./ sth.) or kit (sb./ sth.) out

kits, kitting, kitted

kit out

يُجَهِّزُ أَوْ يَزُوِّدُ بِالْعَتَادِ.

e.g. The soldiers were kitted out and ready to go.

kneel down

kneels, kneeling, kneeled or knelt

kneel down

يَرْكَعُ. يَسْجُدُ. يَجْنُو.

e.g. He knelt down to pray.

knit together (sth.) or knit (sth.) together

knits, knitting, knitted or knit

knit together

يَلْصِقُ أَوْ يَصِلُ أَشْيَاءَ بِنِغْضِهَا.

e.g. Broken bones take time to knit together.

knit up

تَنْسُجُ (بِالْإِبْرَةِ).

e.g. She had knitted up the front before she ran out of wool.

knock (sb.) about/ around (غَامِيَّة)

knocks, knocking, knocked

knock about/ around

(١) يُسَيِّرُ مَعَامِلَةَ (زَوْجَتَهُ مَثَلًا) يَضْرِبُهَا وَيَرْكَلُهَا.

e.g. Her husband used to knock her about.

(٢) يُزْهِقُ. يُنْعِبُ (عَامِّيَّة).

e.g. A long-haul flight like that can really knock you down.

knock about/ around (swh.) (غَامِيَّة)

يَنْسَكُّعُ. يَنْتَقِلُ مِنْ مَكَانٍ لِمَكَانٍ بِدُونِ هَدَفٍ.

e.g. I spent most of my time knocking about the house.

be knocking about/ around (swh.)

(always in continuous tenses) (غَامِيَّة)

شَيْءٌ مُهْمَلٌ مُوجُودٌ فِي مَكَانٍ.

e.g. Isn't there a spanner knocking about here somewhere?

knock about/ around with (sb.)

knock about/ around together

تَنْقُضِي أَوْفَاتِكَ مَعَ أَصْدِقَاءِ أَوْ أَحِبَّةٍ.

e.g. We used to knock around together at college.

knock (sb.) back (sth.) (غَامِيَّة)

knock back

يُكَلِّفُ مَبْلَغًا كَبِيرًا.

e.g. A car like that would knock you back a few thousand.

knock (sb.) back

(الْحَبْرَ يَضُومُ. يَذْهَبُ. يُدِيرُ الرَّأْسَ).

e.g. Jack's death really knocked her back.

knock back (sth.) or knock (sth.) back

يَعْبُ الشَّرَابِ. يَنْزِرُهُ بِسُرْعَةٍ.

e.g. He knocked back two double whiskies.

knock back (sb./ sth.) or knock

(sb./ sth.) back

(غَامِيَّة)

يَزِدُّ عَرْضًا. يَزْفُضُ عَرْضًا.

e.g. I offered him 10.000 for the car but he knocked me back.

knock down (sb.) or knock (sb.) down

(١) يَطْرَحُ (شَخْصًا) أَرْضًا (بِسَيَّارَةٍ) مَثَلًا.

e.g. She got knocked down by a motorbike.

(٢) يَدْفَعُ (شَخْصًا) بِعَنْفٍ فَيَقَعَ.

e.g. He punched his attacker in the face and knocked him down.

knock down (sth.) or knock (sth.) down

(١) يَهْدِمُ. يُزِيلُ مَبْنَى أَوْ حَائِطًا.

e.g. They've knocked down the old cinema and built a super-market in its place.

١) جُرِّئُوا فِطْقَةً أَكْثَرًا إِلَى أَعْزَمِهِ لِيَسْهُلَ نَقْلُهَا.
e.g. The furniture is knocked down and shipped overseas.

knock-down (adj.)

e.g. It's a knockdown table, we assembled it ourselves.

٢) عَامَّةً يَتَقَاَصَى أَجْرًا.

e.g. He sometimes knocks down 500 for a job.

٤) يَعْْبُدُ. يَنْسَرِبُ كَمَثَلَاتٍ كَبِيرَةٍ.

e.g. He's been in the bar knocking down beers most of the evening.

e.g. We got them to knock the price down because of the damage.

e.g. The auctioneer knocked the lot down to him.
