e.g. We made after him in a van.

make away with

e.g. Thieves raided the premises and made away with \$10,000 in cash.

make for (swh.) (never passive)

يَتَّجِهَ نَحْوَ (مَكَانٍ).

e.g. He got up and made for the exit, looking fairly ill.

make for (sth.) (never passive, never in continuous tenses)

e.g. Ironically, food rationing is made for a healthier population.

(٢) تَكُونُ رَأْيًا فِي شَيْءٍ أَوْ شَخْصٍ.

e.g. Poor service does not make for satisfied customers.

e.g. What do you make of this letter?

e.g. She's a bit of a mystery-I've never known what to make of her.

make off

e.g. When the police arrived, the burglars made off.
