e.g. News certainly get about quickly in these parts.

(3) (شَخْصٌ) يُسَافِرُ كَثِيرًا.

e.g. You're off to Canada? You get about a bit, don't you?

(4) يُقِيمُ عِلَاقَاتِ جِنْسِيَّةٍ مَعَ أَفْرَادِ مُخْتَلِفَةٍ.

e.g. He gets about a bit, does Alex. I never see him with the same woman twice.

e.g. You should get after the kids about the mess in their rooms.

get ahead

e.g. It's tough for any woman to get ahead in politics.

get along

e.g. I don't really get along with my husband's sister.

e.g. He keeps getting at me and I really don't know what I've done wrong.

(٢) يَرِيئِي (شَخْصًا) فِي مَحْكَمَةِ مَثَلًا.

e.g. The accused claimed that the witness had been got at.

be getting at (sth.) (always in continuous tenses)

e.g. What are you getting at?

get at (sth.)

e.g. She's inherited a lot of money but she's not allowed to get at it till she's 21.

e.g. She worked as a doctor for a few years but eventually decided to get back to research.

get back to (sb.)

سَيَقَاوِدُ الْإِتِّصَالِ (التَّيْلِفُونِيَّ مَثَلًا).

e.g. I'll get back to you later this afternoon with more details.

get back to (sth.)

يَعُودُ لِإِضْوَاعِ مَا.

e.g. It was ages before I got back to sleep.

get behind

e.g. I don't want her to stay away from school so much or she'll get behind.

e.g. They got behind with the house payments when the interest rates went up.

e.g. They stopped the bus and got off.

(٢) تَقَادِرُ مَكَانَ العَمَلِ فِي اليَعَادِ.
e.g. What time do you get off work?
get (sb.) off (sth.)

(الْحَامِي) يَنْجِي مَوْكَلَهُ مِنَ العِقَابِ، يَبْرِئُهُ مِنَ النُّهْمَةِ.
e.g. She was charged with fraud, but her lawyer managed to get her off.
Get off (sb./ sth.) (always an order)

e.g. If he tries putting his arm round you again, just tell him to get off.

e.g. It only took a couple of months before

e.g. It's getting on toward seven.

get out

(١) يَخْرُجُ مِنْ مَكَانٍ أَوْ مَرْكَبَةٍ.

e.g. As he got out of the car his wallet fell
out of his pocket.

(٢) يَخْرُجُ مِنْ بَيْنِهِ بِقَصْدِ النُّزْهَةِ.

e.g. She doesn't go out so much now that
she's got a baby.
