## hack around

بَدَّدَ الْوَقْتَ وَضَبَّعَهُ فِي أَعْمَالٍ تَأْوِيهِ.

e.g. He's been hacking around all day and getting on everyone's nerves.

## hack into

تَنَحَّلَ عَلَى نِظَامِ كَمْبِيُوتِرٍ سَخَّصَ آخَرَ تُونِ إِذْنٍ قَانُونِيٍّ وَتَسْتَخْرِجَ مَعْلُومَاتٍ.

e.g. A student had managed to hack into some top secret government data.

## hack off (sb.) or hack (sb.) off

بُضَائِقَ شَخْصًا. بَزَعَهُ.

e.g. It really hacks me off the way he expects me to do everything for him.

## hacked off (adj.)

e.g. What are you looking so hacked off about?

## hack down

بَقَطَعَ (الشَّجَائِرَ).

e.g. He hacked down the undergrowth to clear a path.

## Hack out

بَقَطَعَ (الشَّجَائِرَ).

e.g. The settlers hacked out a clearing in the wilderness where they would eventually build their homes.

## hail from (sth.) (never in continuous tenses)

## hails, hailed

## hail from

بِأَيِّ مِنْ (أَيِّ مَكَانٍ وَمِيْلَادِك).

e.g. Where do you hail from (come from) with an accent like that?

## hail down

الْحِجَارَةَ تَنْهَالُ عَلَى.

e.g. Stone hailed down on them

e.g. The prophet hailed down curses on the heads of the men who would not heed him.

## ham up

## hams, hamming, hammed

بَتَضَعُ بِتَلَّ بِطَرِيقَةٍ مَبَالِغٍ فِيهَا.

e.g. Lawrence plays the part of a film star hamming it up hilariously in every scene.

## hammer away at (sth.)

## hammers, hammering, hammered

## hammer away at

(أ) بِطَرَقَ. بِسْتَوِيَرٍ فِي الطَّرَقِ.

e.g. He has been hammering away in the shed for hours.

(أ) بِسَعَى بِكُلِّ جُهْدٍ (لِحَلِّ مُشْكِلَةٍ مَثَلًا).

e.g. Poor Mark's been hammering away at his report all the week end.

e.g. She hammers away at the same point for three whole pages.

e.g. He kept hammering away at the witness.

## hammer in/ into

تَرَدَّدَ شَيْئًا مِرَارًا وَتَكَرَّرًا لِتُنْبِتَهُ فِي الْعَقْلِ.

e.g. Its an important principle and it has to be hammered in.

## hammer out (sth.) or hammer (sth.) out

(شَخْصَانِ) يَتَنَاقِشَانِ وَيَتَجَادَلَانِ حَتَّى يَفْتَعَا.

e.g. Our lawyers expect to hammer out an agreement with the industry within a few months.

## (sth.) around/ round

## hands, handing, handed

## hand around/ round

بِقَدَمِ أَكْلًا أَوْ سُرْبًا يَكُلُّ شَخْصٌ عَلَى حِدَةٍ فِي مَجْمُوعَةٍ.

e.g. Could you hand these mints round with the coffee.

hand back (sth.) or hand (sth.) back

(١) تُرْجِعْ شَيْئًا بِيَدِكَ لِمَنْ أَعْطَاهُ لَكَ.

e.g. No, I've never seen him before, I said handing the photograph back.

(٢) تُعِيدُ (جَائِزَةً) إِلَى مُصَدِّرِهَا.

e.g. She had broken the rules of the contest and had to hand back the prize.

(٣) فِي التَّلِيْفِرِزُونَ أَوْ الرَّادِيُو بِتَوَقُّفِ التَّكَلِّمِ وَيَقُودُ إِلَى الْأَسْتُوْدِيُو.

e.g. No more news at the scene of the accident, so I'll hand you back to the London studio.

hand down (sth.) or hand (sth.) down

(١) يُورِثُ. يَنْقُلُ (الْعَادَاتِ وَالْتَقَالِيدَ مَثَلًا) (مِنْ جِيلٍ إِلَى جِيلٍ).

e.g. These traditions have been handed down from generation to generation.

(٢) يُعْلِنُ حُكْمًا قَضَائِيًّا.

e.g. The judge is expected to hand down a life sentence this week.

(٣) نُسَلِّمُ شَيْئًا لِشَخْصٍ فِي مَكَانٍ أَسْفَلَ مِنْكَ.

e.g. You stand there and I'll hand them down to you.

hand in (sth.) or hand (sth.) in

(١) يُسَلِّمُ (رِسَالَةً) بِالْيَدِ.

e.g. All essays must be handed in on time.

(٢) نُسَلِّمُ شَيْئًا لِشَخْصٍ ذِي سُلْطَةِ.

e.g. Please hand your passport in at the office.

(٣) نُسَلِّمُ اسْتِغْفَالَتَكَ إِلَى رَئِيسِكَ.

e.g. I feel like handing in my resignation.

hand on (sth.) or hand (sth.) on

(١) نُسَلِّمُ شَيْئًا أَنْتَهَيْتَ مِنْهُ بِالْيَدِ.

e.g. The papers are signed by an official before being handed on to the next department.

(٢) يُورِثُ. يَنْقُلُ (عَادَاتِ أَوْ فِكْرًا) مِنْ جِيلٍ إِلَى جِيلٍ.

e.g. These dances have been handed on from one generation to the next.

hand out (sth.) or hand (sth.) out

(١) يُوزِعُ (كُتُبًا، مَسْئُورَاتٍ).

e.g. They were standing in the street handing out leaflets to passersby.

e.g. He likes handing out advice to everyone.

Hand out (n.)

نُقُودٌ، مَلَابِسٌ مُسْتَعْمَلَةٌ، طَعَامٌ.

يُوزَعُ عَلَى الْفُقَرَاءِ.

We don't expect handouts, only what is rightfully ours.

hand over (sth.) or hand (sth.) over

يُسَلِّمُ شَيْئًا لِشَخْصٍ آخَرَ.

e.g. The driver was forced to hand over the car keys and was left standing on the roadside.

hand over (sth./ sb.) or hand (sth./ sb.) over

(١) يُسَلِّمُ السُّلْطَةَ أَوْ الْمَسْئُولِيَّةَ لِشَخْصٍ آخَرَ.

e.g. Dr Clarke will be handing over responsibility for her patients from next month.

(٢) يُسَلِّمُ لِلسُّلْطَةِ.

e.g. The police handed over the man to the prison authorities.

handover (n.)

hang about (always an order) (عَالِيَةٌ)

تَوَقَّفْ (عَمَّا تَعْمَلُهُ أَوْ تَقُولُهُ).

e.g. Hang about ! You can't just take it without asking her.

hang about/ around/ round (swb.) (عَالِيَةٌ)

hang about/ around/ round

(١) (الصَّبِي) يَتَسَكَّعُ، يَفْتُلُ الْوَقْتَ، يَحُومُ حَوْلَ الْبُنَّانِ.

e.g. I spent quite a bit of my youth just hanging about on street corners

(٢) تَتَوَلَّى، تُبْطِنُ.

e.g. If you hang about any more you'll miss the train.

hang about (عَامِدِيَّة)  
around, round together

(مَجْمُوعَةٌ مِنَ النَّاسِ تَمُضِي أَفْرَادَهَا الْوَقْتَ مَعًا.)

e.g. There were ten of us who used to hang around together.

hang about  
around/ round with

بِضَائِقِ شَخْصًا وَتَمُضِي الْوَقْتَ مَعَهُ.

e.g. I've got no idea who she hangs around with these days.

hang back

(١) يَتَرَدَّدُ فِي عَمَلِ شَيْءٍ.

e.g. Hadley was hanging back from signing the agreement.

(٢) يَتَرَجَّعُ، يُحْجِمُ عَنْ (عَادَةٍ مِنَ الْخَوْفِ أَوْ الْخَجَلِ).

e.g. The others rushed over but I hung back and watched to see what would happen.

hang in there (عَادِيَّة) (عَادَةُ (أَمْرٍ) عَادِيَّة)

تَسْتَمِرُّ فِي عَمَلِ شَيْءٍ رَعْمَ صُعُوبَتِهِ. تَصْبِرُ.

e.g. Hang in there- things will get better-try to hang in a little longer.

hang on (عَامِدِيَّة)

(١) يَنْتَظِرُ لَكُنْهَ فَنَصْبِرُهُ.

e.g. We're busy at the moment. Can you hang on a minute?

(٢) تَسْتَوِيذُ عَلَى شَخْصٍ أَوْ شَيْءٍ.

e.g. Hang on the rail as you go down the ramp.

(٣) تَسْتَمِرُّ فِي عَمَلِ شَيْءٍ رَعْمَ صُعُوبَتِهِ.

e.g. It's all about hanging on and trying not to let the situation get to you.

hang (sth.) on (sb.)

تَلُومُ شَخْصًا عَلَى عَمَلِ شَيْءٍ مَا.

e.g. He was afraid the police would hang the breaking on him.

hang on to/ unto (sth.)

(١) (الْمَتَسَلِّقُ) يَتَّعَلِقُ بِهِ. يَتَّكِبُ بِهِ (الْحَبْلُ مَثَلًا).

e.g. The climber on the ledge hung on precariously, waiting for help.

(٢) كَتَفِظْ بِشَيْءٍ وَلَا تَمَرِّطْ فِيهِ.

e.g. You should hang on to that painting, it might be worth a lot of money one day.

hang on/ upon (sth.)

بِعْتِمَادِ عَلَى.

e.g. The project's future hangs mainly on the outcome of a recent grant application.

hang out (عَامِدِيَّة)

تَمُضِي وَقْتًا طَوِيلًا فِي مَكَانٍ أَوْ مَعَ شَخْصٍ.

e.g. It's where all the students hang out.

e.g. Mainly he hangs out with kids his own age.

hang out (n.) (عَامِدِيَّة)

مَكَانٌ لِلتَّجْمَعِ.

e.g. The café was a favourite hang out for artists.

hang out (sth.) or hang (sth.) out

تَنْشُرُ (الْقَيْسِل) عَلَى حَبْلِ فِي الْخَارِجِ مَثَلًا.

e.g. It's raining and I've just hung the washing out.

hang out for

بَصَرَ عَلَى مَطَالِيهِ.

e.g. The striking workers hung out for more money before they resume their work.

hang over (sb./ sth.)

مُشْكَلَةٌ تَتَسَلَطُ عَلَى شَخْصٍ فَتَقْلِقُهُ (تُسَبِّبُ لَهُ الْأَرْقَ).

e.g. I've got this job interview hanging over my head.

a hang over (n.)

آثَارُ مَا بَعْدَ شُرْبِ الْخَمْرِ.

hang together

(١) (الرِّجَالُ) يَتَّحِدُونَ. يَتَسَانَدُونَ. يَتَعَاضِدُونَ فِي وَاقْتِ الشَّدَّةِ مَثَلًا.

e.g. We've all got to hang together if we're going to win this one.

(٢) (أَحْدَاثٌ قِصَّةٌ) مُتَرَابِطَةٌ. مَحْبُوكَةٌ مَسْبُوكَةٌ.  
تَبْدُو حَقِيقَةً.

e.g. Somehow her story just doesn't quite hang together.

hang up

نُهِىَ مَكَالَتَهُ تَلْبِغُومِيَّةً. نَضَعَ السَّمَاعَةَ فَجَاءَهُ.

e.g. I was telling her all about it and then she just hung up (on me).

hang up (sth.) or hang (sth.) up

(١) تَعَلَّقَ (المَلَابِسَ مَثَلًا) عَلَى السَّمَاعَةِ.

e.g. She hung up her coat on a hook by the door.

(٢) تَعَلَّقَ صُورَةَ مَثَلًا.

e.g. They hung the pictures up on the walls.

be hung up (always passive) (عَاقِبَةٌ)

تَعَانَى مِنْ مُشْكَلَةٍ نَفْسِيَّةٍ أَوْ عَاطِفِيَّةٍ.

e.g. She's hung up on the way her parents never showed any love for her as a child.

hang-up (n.)

مُشْكَلَةٌ سَبَبُكَوَجِيَّةٍ.

e.g. He's got a hang-up about his lack of education.

hang up (sb./ sth.) or hang (sb./ sth.) up

يَعْطَلُ. يُؤَخَّرُ.

e.g. We were hung up in traffic for over an hour.

hang it up

نُعْتَزِمُ التَّخَلِّيَ عَنْ شَيْءٍ.

e.g. If the job doesn't get better I'm going to hang it up.

hang with (عَاقِبَةٌ سَمُوقِيَّةٌ)

تَرَافِقُ.

e.g. Who's that guy I saw you hanging with.

hanker after/ for (sth.)

hankers, hankering, hankered

Hanker after/ for

يَتَوَقَّعُ. يَجِنُّ إِلَى. تَضَبُّو نَفْسُهُ إِلَى.

e.g. Sometimes I really hanker after home cooking.

happen on/ upon (sb./ sth.)

happens, happening, happened

happen along/ by past

تَعُدَّرَ عَلَى شَيْءٍ أَوْ تُقَابِلَ شَخْصًا مُصَادَفَةً. عَرَضًا.

e.g. I happened upon that old picture yesterday, you know, the one we were talking about.

be hardened to (sth.) (always passive)

harden to

يَقْوَى. يَجْعَلُهُ قَادِرًا عَلَى حَمْلِ الصَّعَابِ. يُحَجِّرُ الْقَلْبَ.

e.g. After two years of war, these people have become hardened to the horrors of bombing.

hate off

يَعْدُو بِسُرْعَةٍ. يَهْرَعُ.

e.g. He hared off down the road.

hark at you (sb.) (تَعْبِيرٌ مَطْحِكٌ)

تَعِيبَ عَلَى شَخْصٍ تَفِيضَةً مَوْجُودَةً فِيكَ.

e.g. Hark at him, calling me lazy when he never even walks anywhere if he can drive.

hark back to (sth.)

harks, harking, harked

hark back to

يَتَذَكَّرُ. يَعُودُ بِذَاكِرَتِهِ إِلَى الْوَرَاءِ وَيَتَكَلَّمُ فِي الْمَوْضُوعِ مِرَارًا حَتَّى يُضَاقِقَ الْغَيْرَ.

e.g. They are always harking back to their days in the army.

never in continuous tenses

شَيْءٍ يُذَكَّرُ بِشَيْءٍ مِثْلِهِ فِي الْمَاضِي.

e.g. And yet his latest offering harks back to his earlier films.

harp on

harps, harping, harped

يُعِيدُ وَيَزِيدُ فِي (مَوْضُوعٍ مَا) يُكْرَّرُ عَلَى نَحْوِ مِثْلِ. يَدُقُّ عَلَى نَفْسِ الْوَتْرِ.

e.g. He keeps harping on about declining standards in education.

hash out (sth.) or hash (sth.) out (عَلَيْتُهُ)

hashes, hashing, hashed

hash out

تُناقِشُ شَيْئًا لِتُتَخَذَ قَرَارًا أَوْ تَحُلَّ مُشْكِلَةٌ.

e.g. Important management issues are hashed out in monthly meetings.

hash over (sth.) or hash (sth.) over

(مَوْضُوع) يُناقِشُ أَكْثَرَ مِنْ مَرَّةٍ أَوْ لِنَتَّةٍ طَوِيلَةٍ.

e.g. This issue has been hashed over again and again and we still have no solution.

hash up (sth.) or hash (sth.) up

يُفْسِدُ (الْخُطَّة).

e.g. She hashed up her next shot and lost the game.

e.g. He's hashed up our plans again.

haul (sb.) before (sb./ sth.) (عَمِيَّة)

hauls, hauling, hauled

haul before

بُسْتَدْعَى لِلْمُؤَلِّمِ أَمَامَ (مَحْكَمَةٍ).

e.g. She was hauled before the courts and ordered to pay a fine.

haul in (sth.) or haul (sth.) in

بَرَقَعَ شَيْئًا نَقِيلًا مِنَ الْمَاءِ.

e.g. When the fisherman hauled in their nets they found them empty.

haul (sb.) into (swh.)

haul in/ into

(الْبُولِيْس) يَسْتَدْعِي شَخْصًا لِتَحْرِي.

e.g. The police hauled him in for questioning.

haul off (sb.) or haul (sb.) off

يَدْفَعُ شَخْصًا إِنْ كَانَ بِمُؤَةٍ.

e.g. The traders were investigated, found guilty, and hauled off to jail.

haul up (sb.) or haul (sb.) up

تُقَدِّمُ شَخْصًا لِلْمَحَاكَمَةِ.

e.g. His son was hauled up before the courts and given a three year sentence.

haul down

يُنْزِلُ. يَسْحَبُ (شَيْئًا) يَعْغُف.

e.g. The sailors hauled down the flag/ sails.

have (sth.) against (sb./ sth.)

has, had

have against (never n continuous tenses)

تَكْرَهُ أَوْ تُخْتَلِفُ فِي الرَّأْيِ مَعَ شَخْصٍ أَوْ شَيْءٍ.

e.g. I have nothing against her-I just don't find her very easy to talk to.

have around/ round

has, having, had

يَسْتَقْبِلُ. يَسْتَضِيْفُ (عَائِلَتَهُ مَثَلًا).

e.g. Shall we have your parents round for dinner next weekend.

have away (لَعَنَهُ سَوْفِيَّة)

(شَخْص) يُتَارِسُ الْجِنْسَ مَعَ أَحَدِهِمْ.

e.g. She's been having it away with some bloke at work.

have (sb.) down as (sth.) (never in continuous tenses)

have down as

تَنْظُرُ إِلَى شَخْصٍ أَوْ تَعْتَبِرُهُ مِنْ نَوْعٍ مَعْتَبَرٍ.

e.g. I had you down as a sporty sort of person.

have in (sth.) or have (sth.) in

نُحْرِنُ كَمِّيَّاتٍ مِنَ الطَّعَامِ أَوْ الشَّرَابِ بِالْمُنْزِلِ.

e.g. We must make sure we have enough food in for the holiday weekend.

have in (sb.) or have (sb.) in

(١) تَسْتَدْعِي (عَامِلًا) لِإِصْلَاحِ شَيْءٍ بِالْمُنْزِلِ.

e.g. We had the builders in last month to do the kitchen extension.

(٢) تَسْتَضِيْفُ بِمُنْزِلِكَ.

e.g. We had Anna and David in for a drink last night.

have off or have (sth.) off

تَأْخُذُ إِجَازَةً مِنَ الْعَمَلِ.

e.g. I'm having a couple of weeks off in September.

have it off (سَوْفِيَّة)

تُتَارِسُ الْجِنْسَ مَعَ.

e.g. They had it off in the back seat of his car.

have on (sth.) or have (sth.) on (never in continuous tenses, never passive)

(١) تَلْبَسُ الْمَلْبَسَ. يَرْتَدِي (مِفْطَحًا).

e.g. He had on a rain coat and boots.

(٢) (رَادِيُو. تِلْفِيزْيُون) فِي حَالِهِ عَمَلٍ (مَفْتُوحٍ عَم).

e.g. He has the TV on the whole time.

have (sth.) on

عِنْدَهُ مَا يَشْغَلُهُ.

e.g. I've got a lot on (I am very busy) at work this month.

have (sb.) on

يُخَدِّعُ. يُضَلِّلُ (عَادَةً عَلَى سَبِيلِ الْمِرَاحِ).

e.g. That's not really his wife-you're having me on.

have (sth.) on you

كَيْفَ لَمَعَكَ (نُقُودًا) مَثَلًا.

e.g. Do you have any money on you?

have (sth.) on (sth./ sb.)

يَكُونُ عِنْدَكَ مَعْلُومَاتٌ ضِدَّ (شَخْصٍ).

e.g. Do you have anything on this organization?

have it out with

نُضَارِحُ شَخْصًا بِمَا يُفْضِيكَ مِنْهُ لِنَسْوِيَةِ الْأُمُورِ  
نُضْفِي النِّزَاعَ.

e.g. Wouldn't it be better to have it out with him, rather than build up all this resentment?

have (sb.) over

تُسْتَقْبِلُ ضُيُوفًا.

e.g. We had some friends over last night.

have (sb.) up

جُرِّهُ (شَخْصًا) لِحَاكِمَةِ الْمُهَاجِمَةِ.

e.g. He was had up for armed robbery.  
hawk about/ around/ round (swh.) (sth.) or  
hawk (sth.) about/ around/ round (swh.)

hawks, hawking, hawked  
hawk about / around/ round

يُنَادِي عَلَى بِضَاعَتِهِ. يَبِيعُ مُتَجَوِّلاً.

e.g. They hawked the paintings around the local shops and split the money they made between them.

haze over

hazes, hazing, hazed

haze over

يَقْبِشُ. يَجْعَلُهُ أَعْبَسًا.

e.g. It was a clear morning but its beginning to haze over now.

head off

heads, heading, headed

يَتَلَفَّى. يَتَحَاسَى. يُبْعَدُ.

e.g. The company is increasing wages in an attempt to head off a strike.

e.g. The speaker seemed intent on heading off awkward questions.

head off/ out

تَبْدَأُ رِحْلَةً. تَعَادِرُ مَكَانًا. يُعَادِرُ إِلَى مَكَانٍ آخَرَ.

e.g. As soon as the school year ended the whole family headed off to the mountains.

e.g. We're heading out early, Make sure you're here on time.

head for

يَتَّجِهُ إِلَى. يَتَوَجَّهُ.

e.g. The ship was heading for Southampton.

head back

يَرْجِعُ. يَتَّوَدُّ إِلَى مَكَانٍ مَا.

e.g. We changed our minds and headed back to London.

head up

يُرَاسُ. يَكُونُ عَلَى رَأْسِ (مُنْتَظَمَةٍ مَثَلًا).

e.g. He heads up a multi-national corporation.

heal over

(الْجُرْحُ) يَلْتَمِ.

e.g. Try to protect that cut until it heals over completely.

heal up

يُسْقَى. يَتَّوَدُّ لِرُوضِهِ الطَّبِيعِيِّ.

e.g. I'm not supposed to use my arm till the bone has healed up completely.

heap (sth.) on/ upon (sb./ sth.)

**heaps, heaping, heaped**  
heap on/ upon

بِكَيْلٍ (الشَّخْصِ) اللَّحْمِ أَوْ الذَّمِّ بِغَمْرٍ يَلْتَمِحُ أَوْ  
بِالْتُّفَدِ.

e.g. Much praise has been heaped on this talented young musician.

heap up (sth.) or heap (sth.) up

بُكُومٍ بِجَمْعٍ فِي كَوْمَةٍ.

e.g. The gardener began to heap up the fallen leaves.

hear (sth.) from (sb.)

**hears, hearing, heard**  
hear from

(١) تَسْمَعُ أَخْبَارًا مِنْ شَخْصٍ مَا أَوْ يَتَّصِلُ بِكَ عَنْ  
طَرِيقِ (التَّيْلِفُونِ أَوْ التَّرِيدِ عَادَةً)

e.g. Please write soon. I look forward to hearing from you.

(٢) (البوليس) يَسْتَمِعُ إِلَى كَلَامِ الشَّاهِدِ.

e.g. The police would like to hear from anyone who might have witnessed the crime.

**have/ had heard of (sb./ sth.)**  
(always in perfect tenses)

hear of

تَعْرِفُ شَيْئًا عَنْ شَخْصٍ أَوْ شَيْءٍ تَسْمَعُ عَنْهُ أَوْ  
تَقْرَأُ عَنْهُ (غَالِبًا بِصِيغَةِ التَّنْفِي).

e.g. I've never heard of him.

not hear of (sth.) or not hear of somebody doing (sth.) (always negative, never in continuous)

لَنْ تَسْمَعَ بِحُدُوثِ شَيْءٍ.

e.g. She'd wanted to go to a late night concert but her mother wouldn't hear of it.

hear (sb.) out

hear out

يُضْفِي إِلَى (الشَّخْصِ أَوْ قِصَّةٍ) حَتَّى النُّهَابَةِ.

e.g. we decided to hear him out before making any judgments on what he had done.

heat up (sth.) or heat (sth.) up

**heats, heating, heated**  
heat up

يَسَخِّنُ (الطَّعَامَ مَثَلًا).

e.g. I was just heating up some soup for lunch.

heat up (sth.) or heat (sth.) up

يُدْفِي (الْحُجْرَةَ مَثَلًا).

e.g. The room was cold when we arrived but soon began to heat up.

heat up

(مَوْقِفٍ أَوْ مَنَاقِشَةٍ) كَتَمَتْ وَيَكُونُ أَكْثَرَ صَرَوَةً.  
مَنَاقِشَةً تَشْتَدُّ.

e.g. United Nations forces were called in as the conflict heated up.
